

# HOW TO USE THE RESOURCE PACK


In 2021 Peer Power Youth (PPY) worked in partnership with the Youth Justice Board for England and Wales (YJB) on a project that aimed to explore co-creation and participation in youth justice services (YJS).

The project team included children from Peer Power Youth (Peer Power Experts) who have a range of lived experience of support services, and an academic working group.



Right from the start, every part of the project was co-created.

1 To start a conversation on each princple between children & practitioners



2. As a tool for benchmarking and planning journeys to co-creation.



3. To reflect upon, assess & evidence your YJS strengths and areas for improvement.

The PICK & MIX OF PARTICIPATION, ARE YOU REALLY CO-CREATING & the DIRECTORY OF PARTICIPATION

These 3 resources were designed to work together to allow for exploration & benchmarking of current practice in a YJS.



Using practical examples to inspire thinking.

The PICK & MIX PARTICIPATION helps YJS consider what method of participation they might pick for different types of activities, as if they might pick sweets from a sweet shop.



The Code can be used directly by children and practitioners at participation events or engagement sessions to set boundaries.



It can also be used as a conversation starter so that YJS can create their own safe storytelling resources.
