

“They’re not Strangers”

- Young people who commit SYV in Newcastle are 2.5 times more likely to have been open to Children’s Social Care (CSC) than the general population. 38% of this cohort were open to CSC during their offending
- Children who are persistently absent from school are 3.8 times more likely to have entered the YJ system
- Young people who experience domestic abuse in the home are 9.1 times more likely to have enter the YJ system
- Substance misuse is a factor against desistance for almost half of Newcastle’s current YJ cohort
- 75% of Newcastle’s First Time Entrants receive Free School Meals (59% for the general Newcastle population)
- Living arrangements are a factor against desistance for 16% of the current caseload
